ORDER FOR MENTAL OBSERVATION AND EVALUATION
T22 O.S.A. § 1175.3.D.2.

NOW on this 13 day of June, 2025, the Application for evaluation of competency comes on for consideration by this Court that a doubt exists as to the present competency and mental health of the Defendant, Louis Carl Guenther.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED, that the Defendant be examined by a qualified forensic evaluator with the intent to determine if the Defendant suffers from a mental illness pursuant to **Title 43A of the Oklahoma Statutes.**

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that Defendant, Louis Carl Guenther, be evaluated with consideration of his competency to stand trial in the above-referenced case(s).

IT IS ALSO FURTHER ORDERED, that all available records/reports of law enforcement agencies, copies of pending charges, prior criminal history, psychiatric, medical, school, jail, Department of Corrections and any other pertinent materials available be made available to the examiner to assist in answering the following statutory questions:

- 1) Is this person able to appreciate the nature of the charges made against such person;
- 2) Is this person able to consult with her lawyer and rationally assist in the defense of such person;

- 3) If the person is unable to appreciate the nature of the charges or to consult and rationally assist in the preparation of the defense, whether the person can attain competency within a reasonable period of time as defined in Section 1175.1 of this title if provided with a course of treatment, therapy or training;
- 4) If the person is a person requiring treatment as defined by Section 1-103 of Title 43A of the Oklahoma Statutes;
- 5) If the person is incompetent because the person is mentally retarded as defined in Section 1408 of Title 10 of the Oklahoma Statutes;
- 6) If the answers to question 4 and 5 are no, why defendant is incompetent; and
- 7) If the person were released, whether such person would presently be dangerous as defined in Section 1175.1 of this title.

After completion of its observation and examination, a written report shall be submitted to the undersigned Judge of the District Court and a copy sent to counsel for the State and for the Defendant. Upon receipt thereof, the court will thereupon issue further proper orders herein.


IT IS, ALSO, FURTHER ORDERED that the criminal proceedings against said Defendant, Louis Carl Guenther, shall be suspended until further order of the court.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, that the McIntosh County Sheriff's Office will transport the Defendant, Louis Carl Guenther, to and from the Oklahoma Department of Mental Health.


