On 06/25/2025 at approximately 2104 hours, I was dispatched a phone report in reference to embezzlement. I contacted Rp-Danielle Briseno who stated she is the president of the Performing Arts Council of Edmond, a non-profit organization. Rp-Briseno stated she wanted to report an embezzlement that occurred within the organization but did not want to press any charges. She further advised that she wanted a report for documentation purposes only.

Rp-Briseno stated she began her role as the president of the organization sometime between the end of May 2025 and the beginning of June 2025. She reported that when she became president, she went to Kirkpatrick bank and got a printout of the bank statements for the organization's checking account so that she could make a budget plan for the next year. She advised that when she looked at the bank statements, she noticed some "suspicious transactions."

Rp-Briseno stated that the previous president of the organization, S-Kyle Owen, was responsible for the finances prior to her. She reported there were Venmo payments made to S-Owen's children, as well as several other suspicious cash withdrawals and debit card transactions. Rp-Briseno stated she and the board of the organization met and went through the statements. She reported they discovered 112 fraudulent transactions made by S-Owen between October 2024 and May 2025. She advised that the fraudulent transactions totaled \$11,890.17.

Rp-Briseno stated she emailed S-Owen on 06/19/2025 and inquired about the transactions. She reported that S-Owen did not admit guilt, he admitted to carelessness and stated he accidentally made the transactions. Rp-Briseno stated S-Owen then met with Rp-Briseno and the board on 06/22/2025. She advised that S-Owen first admitted to \$4,000 in "accidental" transactions and then admitted to another \$1,000. Rp-Briseno reported that on 06/23/2025, S-Owen stated he would reimburse the organization for the full amount since he used the money for "personal use." She advised that on 06/24/2025, S-Owen gave her a cashier's check for \$10,000 and a personal check for \$1,890.17 but stated the funds for the personal check would not be available for a few days.

Rp-Briseno stated that since S-Owen returned the money, the organization did not want to pursue charges at this time. She reported that if the funds for the personal check from S-Owen do not become available, the council will reconvene and decide what further action should be taken.
