TITLE OF REPORT

SUMMARY OF RICHARDSON

On 07/26/2025 at approximately 8:02 P.M. LT TOMMY RICHARDSON was contacted by Oklahoma Highway Patrol dispatch and notified of a domestic incident. The domestic involved Coal County Sheriff JASON SMITH SMITH, his current wife [REDACTED] SMITH ([REDACTED]), Coal County Deputy [REDACTED], and [REDACTED]'s spouse CHAD [REDACTED] (CHAD). RICHARDSON proceeded to the scene and arrived at approximately 8:31 p.m. This location was at [REDACTED] 1670 Road in Coal County, a residential area owned by SMITH's family.

Upon arrival, RICHARDSON observed Choctaw Lighthorse Police Officers ROY HUMMEL and SHELBY MILAM were on scene along with Trooper MARK BENEDICT. RICHARDSON observed SMITH standing in front of the residence, leaning on a pipe fence. SMITH was speaking to BENEDICT in a loud voice, and as RICHARDSON observed his actions, he assumed that SMITH was intoxicated. RICHARDSON approached a witness to the event, [REDACTED], and asked her what occurred. [REDACTED] stated that the Sheriff had contacted her and asked her to come to the residence to discuss work. SMITHS' wife, [REDACTED], showed up at this time, and they argued about [REDACTED] being at the residence. SMITH pushed [REDACTED] during the verbal altercation, according to [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] husband, CHAD, showed up at this time and parked his vehicle in front of the residence, but never exited the vehicle. Chad and SMITH had a verbal altercation about [REDACTED] being at this residence. SMITH slapped CHAD while he was sitting in the vehicle.

RICHARDSON, while speaking to [REDACTED], observed that she was in her patrol uniform and had driven the patrol vehicle to this residence. RICHARDSON also smelled the odor of alcohol coming from [REDACTED] person. RICHARDSON asked [REDACTED] if she had been drinking alcohol. [REDACTED] stated that she had not. RICHARDSON told [REDACTED] that she is in uniform, has a sidearm, and that he could smell alcohol, so she had better not lie. [REDACTED] that she had been drinking with SMITH while at the residence. RICHARDSON had [REDACTED] take her duty weapon off and place it in a nearby Coal County Patrol Unit.

RICHARDSON then spoke with SMITH and asked him what had occurred. SMITH stated that he had contacted [REDACTED] and asked her to stop by and discuss some accusations that the commissioners and former sheriff were making. SMITHS' wife and CHAD showed up an undetermined amount of time later, and SMITH stated that this "blew up". SMITH stated that he did not touch his wife or slap CHAD. SMITH told RICHARDSON he

(SMITH) was drinking alcohol. RICHARDSON asked SMITH if [REDACTED] had been drinking alcohol, and SMITH stated she had a sip. During this conversation, it appeared to RICHARDSON that SMITH was intoxicated.

RICHARDSON then contacted Assistant District Attorney CHEYANNE ANDERSON and informed her of the information gathered at the scene. ANDERSON informed RICHARDSON that he (RICHARDSON) could handle the investigation or contact the Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation (OSBI) for assistance. RICHARDSON informed ANDERSON that he would also contact Major ERIC CANNADY of the Oklahoma Highway Patrol to obtain his opinion on the matter. It was determined that OSBI would be contacted for assistance. RICHARDSON spoke with Captain ADAM WHITNEY of the OSBI. WHITNEY advised RICHARDSON that he and LT SHAWN WARD would both be en route to conduct an investigation. OSBI agents arrived on the scene around 11:20 P.M. and started interviewing the parties involved. RICHARDSON stayed on scene until the investigation was completed.

NOTE: RICHARDSON has audio and video recording of the event. Due to the distance from the patrol vehicle, the audio is occasionally faint and difficult to understand.
